Briefly, the dinner club is a sharing plan, by which actors, employed and unemployed, gather at the Hotel Woodstock, New York, for dinner together, and the employed pay for their own dinners and those of the unemployed.

Miss Ingeborg Torrup, who has been playing leading parts with Walter Hampden, will dance, and Clifford Walker will give a musical monologue during the afternoon. Members of the Surry Players will serve tea.
