The colony's music lovers are looking forward to a recital tomorrow by Miss Margaret Sittig, violinist. Miss Sittig's program, which will be given at 3:30 P. M., at Elsinore, the Summer residence of Mrs. Henry F. Dimock, opens with a chaconne by Vitali and concludes with a Mendelssohn concerto, in which Miss Sittig will be accompanied by her father, Frederick V. Sittig. The other numbers will be from the works of Valdez, Kreisler, Schubert and Brahms. Among the patrons will be Dr. Walter Damosch.

The program of the Kebo Valley Golf Club for the week includes another putting contest and tea on Monday, a competition for mixed foursomes on Wednesday and a medal play handicap event on Saturday.

A fashion show, in which younger members of the colony will model, is to be held at the garden in Mount Desert Street on Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock for the benefit of the Mount Desert Island Hospital.
